VERIFIED ORIGINAL APPLICATION FOR POST-CONVICTION RELIEF.
REQUEST FOR EVIDENTIARY HEARING, AND REQUEST FOR DISCOVERY

DEATH PENALTY CASE

Petitioner, JESSIE J. CUMMINGS, by the undersigned post-conviction counsel, pursuant to the Oklahoma Post-Conviction Procedure Act, 22 O.S. 1995, §1080 et seq., and Rule 9.7, Rules of the Court of Criminal Appeals, and Article 2, §§2,3,6,7,9 & 10 of the Oklahoma Constitution, files this Verified Original Application for Post-Conviction Relief. This is the first time an application for post-conviction relief has been filed on behalf of Mr. Cummings.

Part A: Procedural History of the Case

The sentences from which relief is sought are a sentence of death, Count I, Murder in the first degree, and a sentence of death, Count II, Murder in the first degree.

- The Court in which the sentence was rendered is the Coal County District Court.
 The case number is CF-94-32.
- On May 9, 1996, the jury found Mr. Cummings guilty. After the sentencing hearing held
 that same day, the jury returned a verdict of death on Counts I and II. On May 30, 1996,
 judgment and sentences were formally imposed on Mr. Cummings.
- Mr. Cummings was sentenced to death on Count I and Count II.

- 4. The presiding judge at Mr. Cummings' trial was the Honorable Doug Gabbard, II.
- Mr. Cummings is currently in custody at the H-Unit, Oklahoma State Penitentiary, P.O. Box 97, McAlester, Oklahoma 74502.

There are no criminal matters pending in other courts against Mr. Cummings, nor is there any sentence, capital or non-capital, to be served by Mr. Cummings in any other jurisdiction.

I. Capital Offense Information

 Mr. Cummings was convicted of two counts of Murder in the first degree, 21 O.S.1991, §701.7, with a sentence of death imposed on each count.

The aggravating factors alleged in the Bill of Particulars (OR 207) are:

Count I, the homicide of Judy Moody Mayo: the existence of a probability that the defendant would commit criminal acts of violence that would constitute a continuing threat to society. Count II, the homicide of Melissa Moody: (1) the existence of a probability that the defendant would commit criminal acts of violence that would constitute a continuing threat to society, and (2) the murder was committed for the purpose of avoiding arrest or prosecution.

The aggravating factors found by the jury were the same as those alleged in the Bill of Particulars.

Mitigating factors listed in the jury instructions (OR 465) that jurors could consider were, inter alia, the following:

Mr. Cummings has been an exemplary prisoner while incarcerated.

Mr. Cummings has a family that loves and cares for him.

There are others more morally culpable for these crimes.

There is a residual doubt as to the guilt of Mr. Cummings.

Mr. Cummings has performed acts of kindness to friends and family.

Mr. Cummings has had an impoverished and deprived background.

Victim Impact Evidence was not introduced at Mr. Cummings' trial.

- The finding of guilty was made after a plea of "not guilty" by Mr. Cummings.
- Mr. Cummings was found guilty by a jury.

The two death sentences were determined by a jury.

II. Non-capital Offense Information

- A Second Amended Felony Information charged Count III, Child Abuse (OR 290). The
 trial court dismissed Count III at the close of the State's case (T. 855-56), because there
 was no evidence to corroborate the testimony of co-defendant Juanita Cummings in
 support of Count III.
- No finding of guilt was made on the non-capital charge.
- The non-capital charge was not submitted to the jury.

III. Case Information

13. Mr. Cummings, who was indigent, was represented by court-appointed counsel in the trial court. The names and addresses of his trial attorneys are as follows:

- 14. Lead counsel was appointed by the trial court. Co-counsel was selected by lead counsel and contracted with by the State through the Oklahoma Indigent Defense System's Capital Trial Division, with a \$5000 cap on compensation paid to co-counsel.
- Mr. Cummings has appealed his convictions to this Court, Case No. F-96-657.

Appellant's Brief was filed on July 7, 1997.

The State, through the office of the Attorney General, filed Brief of Appellee on November 3, 1997.

A Reply Brief was filed on behalf of Mr. Cummings on November 24, 1997.

Oral Argument was presented to this Court on March 10, 1998.

To date Mr. Cummings' direct appeal case has not been remanded to the District Court for an evidentiary hearing. An Application for an Evidentiary Hearing, alleging facts in support of a claim of ineffective assistance of trial counsel, was filed by appellate counsel on July 7, 1997. That motion is presently pending before this Court.
