[redacted] propped the eastern-most door to the cafeteria open so that the head cook, whom he identified as [redacted] could enter. He recalls that [redacted] he did a cursory examination of the cafeteria and at that time saw no bags or backpacks on the floor of the cafeteria.

[redacted] walk through the cafeteria at the commencement of each class period [redacted] He does not recall seeing any objects unattended on the floor of the cafeteria on any of his walk throughs that day. [redacted] said that if he did see an object it was his habit to put the item on the table so that the person who lost or left it could return and easily find it. He is quite certain that he would have noticed an odd shaped duffel bag or larger container during one of his walk throughs.

[redacted] did note however, that on April 20, 1999, a student who had been assigned community service was in the

cafeteria helping to sweep the floor and wipe down tables and may have seen something. [REDACTED] does not know the student's name.

[REDACTED] wait at the northwest corner of the kitchen until approximately 10:30 am when he would go into the kitchen and get his lunch. On April 20, 1999, he said he was waiting at the northwest corner until approximately 10:50 am, when he went into the kitchen to prepare his lunch. Around 11:15 am, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] when a young girl came running into the cafeteria and said words to the effect of, "Someones been shot." [REDACTED] looked out the window and saw a student laying in the parking lot close to the soccer field.

At around that time a window on the south side of the cafeteria with a Columbine symbol etched in it was blown out by either an explosion or a bullet. [REDACTED] screamed, "Get down" to students around him and at that time recalls hearing sporadic gunfire. [REDACTED] directed students to get under tables as the gunfire increased. He noticed some students were running toward the stairs and the double doors leading to the south parking lot.

[REDACTED] recalls hearing gunfire upstairs above the cafeteria and he went to the stairs that led to that area. He is not sure but thinks he went all the way to the music room located on the northeast side of the building where he saw students fleeing in all directions. He then retraced his steps back toward the cafeteria and library area. As he approached the top of the steps in front of the library leading to the cafeteria, he encountered a teacher he identified as [REDACTED] who said words to the effect [REDACTED] Dave Sanders has been shot. Call an ambulance." [REDACTED] thinks [REDACTED] also may have said that two students had been shot, but he is not sure.

[REDACTED] reached for his walkie-talkie and as he turned back toward the library he saw a student in a black trench coat holding a pistol and what [REDACTED] thought was a long barreled grenade launcher. He said the shoulder weapon was strapped across the individual's chest with the butt of the weapon on the right side of the individual's body. For a brief moment [REDACTED] and the subject were face-to-face and he

noticed that under the trench coat the individual appeared to be wearing a white shirt. [REDACTED] did not recognize the individual. [REDACTED] turned and ran to the landing leading to the cafeteria when he heard shooting behind him. He believed at that time the individual in the trench coat was coming down the stairs behind him.

[REDACTED] believes that around this time he saw [REDACTED] whom he believes is a social studies teacher. He, [REDACTED] were moving toward the kitchen when he heard a large explosion behind them. [REDACTED] believes it was a pipe bomb and it blew [REDACTED] down to the ground. He and [REDACTED] picked [REDACTED] up and carried him into the kitchen where they encountered a student, whom he identified as [REDACTED] plus three other unidentified students. [REDACTED] warned them back and the students went toward the storeroom area in the rear of the kitchen.

[REDACTED] huddled down behind the dishwasher table and [REDACTED] closed the door behind them. He is not sure why the gunman did not follow them into the kitchen. He does recall that several students insisted on leaving and left on their hands and knees out the western side of the kitchen toward the door that led to the west parking lot.

[REDACTED] encountered [REDACTED] and a number of other students in the northern storeroom area of the kitchen and recalls that [REDACTED] and 17 students entered the storeroom and locked themselves in. He believes the cooks were locked in their office.

[REDACTED] then left the kitchen and went back through the cafeteria to the auditorium and found the door unlocked. As he entered the auditorium he noticed several students sitting near the top of the auditorium and he saw a teacher whom he identified as [REDACTED] sitting with the students. [REDACTED] motioned the students to come to him and all the students came down to the double doors leading into the auditorium. [REDACTED] told them there was an extreme emergency and to get out as quickly as possible. He believes 50 to 80 students ran out the auditorium and down what he referred to as the business hall which leads to the eastern lower section of the school.

[REDACTED] believes that the movement out of the auditorium drew the attention of the individual in the trench coat and as he stood at the base of the stairs he looked up and saw at least one of the individuals who was doing the shooting, coming around the corner of the stairs. [REDACTED] believes it was the same man he had seen in front of the library. [REDACTED] ran back through the cafeteria and as he ran through the cafeteria, he noticed a student lying on the floor. When he got to the end of the cafeteria [REDACTED] did not see the subject, so he went back upstairs and saw [REDACTED] near the landing of the stairs.

[REDACTED] again saw the shooter standing in front of the library and it is his recollection that as he and [REDACTED] began running down the stairs together, the shooter began firing rounds at them. [REDACTED] said that as he and [REDACTED] entered the kitchen an explosion occurred behind them and he could hear objects hitting the metal door on the serving line.

Once he and [REDACTED] were on the ground in the kitchen, they crawled underneath a large industrial oven, but realized that hiding place was not secure. Around this time [REDACTED] heard what he described as a "whoosh" and saw fire in the vicinity of the cafeteria and the kitchen. [REDACTED] determined that he was in a "bad place" and moved further into the kitchen. He then entered the walk-in cooler and [REDACTED] went into the freezer. After approximately one minute, [REDACTED] who was carrying a radio, called [REDACTED] and told him to open the door and that he was coming in the walk-in cooler. The door opened and [REDACTED] entered the walk-in cooler.

They propped a food cart against the door and prepared several large objects to use as weapons in case the gunman opened the door. [REDACTED] kept trying to make contact with two individuals, whom he identified as [REDACTED] on his radio. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] answered and [REDACTED] told him they were in the cooler and to tell him when it was safe to come out. [REDACTED] recalled hearing gunshots for a long period of time while he was in the cooler, but could not tell where they were coming from. He believes he saw shadows moving around the kitchen but did not see anyone.

[redacted] believes he heard shooting for up to an hour to an hour and thirty minutes after the initial incident. He said at one point there was approximately a 20 minute interval of silence and then the shooting began again. He recalled looking at his watch at 1:50 pm, and around that time recalls hearing shooting and then he glanced at his watch at 2:25 pm, but heard nothing.

At approximately 2:35 pm, a voice on the radio told him that the SWAT Team was outside the doors and [redacted] [redacted] came out of the cooler.

Results of interview reveal [redacted] were in an Internet Chat Room sometime between the 04/01-08/1999, and communicated with someone by the name of Eric (LNU) from Colorado.

[redacted] both advised the communication was normal and there was no mention of anything relating to captioned investigation.

Inasmuch as no further investigation exists in CT., NH considers this lead covered.

EACH OF THESE TEAMS IS COORDINATED BY A JEFFERSON COUNTY (JEFFCO) SHERIFF'S OFFICE (SO) DEPUTY AND AN FBI SA. THE INVESTIGATION IS BEING MANAGED BY A JEFFCO SO CAPTAIN, WITH COORDINATION AND ASSISTANCE PROVIDED BY AN FBI SUPERVISOR. FBI DENVER IS ALSO COORDINATING THE RAPID START INFORMATION MANAGEMENT SYSTEM AND HAS AN SA REPRESENTATIVE ON ALL INVESTIGATIVE TEAMS. CAPTIONED SUBJECTS FROM THREE AS-YET-UNIDENTIFIED INDIVIDUALS AT A GUN SHOW IN DENVER IN NOVEMBER OR DECEMBER, 1998. THE TEC-9 APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN PURCHASED BY KLEBOLD FROM AN INDIVIDUAL IN JANUARY OR FEBRUARY, 1999.

THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY'S OFFICE (USA0), ALONG WITH THE JEFFERSON COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE ARE AWARE OF ALL ONGOING INVESTIGATION AND ARE MAKING THE NECESSARY PROSECUTIVE DECISIONS.

PREVIOUS STATEMENTS MADE BY SUBJECTS, AS WELL AS NUMEROUS INTERNET POSTINGS, MOSTLY BY HARRIS, SEEM TO INDICATE THAT THEY PLANNED AND CARRIED OUT THIS ACT ALONE. HOWEVER, EYEWITNESS ACCOUNTS STILL TO BE CORROBORATED INDICATE THE POSSIBILITY OF ADDITIONAL INDIVIDUALS SEEN WITH CAPTIONED SUBJECTS IMMEDIATELY BEFORE THE INCIDENT BEGAN. INTERVIEWS IN EXCESS OF 200 STUDENTS AND FACULTY WHO MAY HAVE SEEN CAPTIONED SUBJECTS BEFORE AND DURING THE INCIDENT ARE UNDERWAY.

AT THIS TIME, RAPID START CONTAINS 528 ENTRIES WITH 443 LEADS PREPARED AND 315 LEADS ASSIGNED.

[redacted] found one person with a screen name [redacted] used the screen name [redacted] began this conversation around 11:30 p.m. He did not finish the conversation until after midnight and for this reason, the computer printout of the conversation is dated Wednesday, April 21, 1999. [redacted] claimed to be a female student named [redacted] from the Columbine High School.

Columbia is aware of the copy cat people on AOL who are pretending to be members of the Trenchcoat Mafia. The main reason Columbia places any credence in this conversation is due to the relative short time between the news releases concerning the shootings and when the conversation took place. Details: For the information of Denver, on 04/23/1999, [redacted] telephone number: [redacted] telephonically advised that on 04/15/1999, at 0947am, she boarded Amtrak Train #807, enroute to Winona, Minnesota. According to [redacted] Train #807's final destination was Washington state. It stopped in Chicago, Illinois, as well, and left there at 215pm.

Being a smoker [redacted] advised that she spent some time in the train's "smoking car" and struck up a conversation with a white female named either [redacted] (phonetic). This female was approximately 5ft/90lbs, blond shoulder length hair in a ponytail, wearing glasses and no makeup. She thought little of this contact until later.

After the train left Chicago, Illinois, she noticed a white male in the "smoking car." This male appeared was in his late teens, 6ft/180lbs, with bleached blond hair cut short. He was wearing a black "trench" coat and spoke German on occasion. He seemed to be alone and she heard him say, to no one in particular, "Someting big is going to happen."

Later on, she saw [redacted] with him. She did not know where either of these people were headed and did not know when

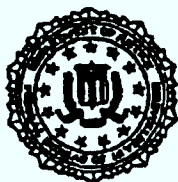

[redacted] at Columbine High School. He normally eats lunch during fourth period, which he has free, and at the end of the period at 11:10, he and his friends normally go outside. On April 20, 1999, just prior to the 11:15 bell, he and his friends [redacted] [Last Name Unknown] were sitting at a table inside the cafeteria near the south window, which faces a parking lot.

[redacted] saw Dylan Klebold walk into the southwest entrance to the cafeteria from the parking lot. He was dressed all in black, with black trousers, black shirt, black boots, a black trenchcoat and a black Colorado Avalanche hat worn backwards, which had a Boston Red Sox emblem sewn on it. [redacted] does not recall Klebold carrying anything, and saw him walk over to the vending machines in the cafeteria.

According to [redacted] during lunch, Klebold and Eric Harris would normally sit in Klebold's BMW in the parking lot on the south side of the cafeteria and watch people. [redacted] only knows Klebold and Harris by sight.

After the 11:15 bell, [redacted] and his friends walked out of the southwest exit of the cafeteria, towards the soccer field. He heard a sound which sounded like fireworks, similar to a string of Blackcat firecrackers going off. [redacted] indicated that prior to April 20, 1999, he had never heard gunfire]. When [REDACTED] looked up, he saw the gunman walking towards the southwest cafeteria entrance.

[REDACTED] also saw a white male dressed in a white short-sleeved tee shirt and blue jeans, kneeling with his back to him near the northwest corner of the cafeteria. He did not recognize this person, and since his back was to him, could only tell he had either light brown or blond hair. This person had no weapon nor other gear visible.
