INTERVIEW OF MEGAN MCALLISTER

LT. DET. MERNER: Just put your name in there that we've advised you of your opportunity to have this interview electronically recorded, which is audiotape which is on the machine there, by the Boston Police Department, and it's whether or not you agree. You agree, you checked off that you agree and you've initialed, and now you're signing.

MS. MCALLISTER: What's the date?

LT. DET. MERNER: The date today is April the 20th.

SGT. DET. DUFF: April 20th.

LT. DET. MERNER: And the time is 3:10 p.m.

Okay. Now I'll witness it, and Sergeant Duff will witness it as well.

BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

Q And just for the record, I'm Sergeant Detective Daniel Duff. It's April 20th. It's 3:03 p.m.

Besides us introducing ourselves and asking you some biological information, demograph -- I should say demographic

information, sorry, we haven't had any real conversation, correct, about --

A Right.

Q Basically we told you we want to talk to you about some ongoing incidents.

A Right, right.

Q Okay. Can you give me a piece of that?

LT. DET. MERNER: Yeah, just take that, okay.

Q And as we explained, we want to talk to you about some ongoing incidents over the past few days, that we received some information that we want to follow up by talking to you and your boyfriend.

A Fiance.

Q Your fiance, I'm sorry.

A That's okay.

Q And maybe some goings-on in and around your neighborhood --

A Mm-hmm.

Q -- or your building. Do you live with him there?

A Yes, I do.

Q Okay. So you live at his apartment building?

1 A Yeah, we do, but I do go home once a month for  
2 doctors' appointments, and we're planning a  
3 wedding, so the wedding's in New Jersey. So I'm  
4 at home once every month for about a week or  
5 two. So it's like -- I spend half my time here  
6 and half my time in New Jersey.

7 Q Okay. And are you working right now?

8 A No, I'm not. I'm going to school in September,  
9 so.

10 Q How old are you?

11 A 25.

12 Q And you're going to be going to school this  
13 coming September?

14 A I'm going to medical school in the Caribbean in  
15 September.

16 Q Okay. Were you working previously?

17 A Not since before my back surgery, which was  
18 2007. I've been looking for work in Boston for  
19 about a year and a half now. I have not found  
20 anything. I can't -- I can only do part-time  
21 work because I have so many back problems.  
22 Before that I was working at a hospital in New  
23 Jersey after I graduated college, so.

24 Q Any part-time jobs, employment, here and there?

1 No, okay.

2 A No.

3 Q And your boyfriend, what's his name?

4 A Philip, P-H-I-L-I-P, Markoff, M-A-R-K-O-F-F.

5 Q Okay. And how long has he lived up here in --

6 A Same amount of time, August.

7 Q August --

8 A Actually, we moved into Highpoint in August, and  
9 before that, he lived closer to school. He goes  
10 to BU Medical School. So he lived like in the  
11 Dorchester area, kind of. It was close to the  
12 BU, like close to this area.

13 LT. DET. MERNER: Do you know where in  
14 Dorchester?

15 MS. MCALLISTER: I forget the name of  
16 the street. It wasn't a good area. It wasn't  
17 --

18 LT. DET. MERNER: Close to the  
19 expressway or --

20 MS. MCALLISTER: It was close to the Red  
21 Line, like just down the street, and there was  
22 like a bus terminal there kind of, I think, so,  
23 and he lived there for a year. That's when he  
24 started medical school. So he's been in

1 school, this is the end of his second year. He  
2 lived close to school that first year, and then  
3 he moved to Quincy with me in August.

4 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

5 Q Who had the apartment first, you or him, in  
6 Quincy?

7 A Him; he moved in first. He takes out student  
8 loans to pay for it. I mean, that's how we're  
9 living right now.

10 Q Okay. And that was in August?

11 A Yeah.

12 Q So he moved to Highpoint in August. Did he move  
13 into that apartment?

14 A Yeah.

15 Q Okay. You've been in the same apartment ever  
16 since you moved in?

17 A Mm-hmm.

18 Q No moving between apartments?

19 A No.

20 Q Okay. Does anyone live with him or with you  
21 there?

22 A No.

23 Q Okay. Anyone used to live with him or you  
24 there?

1 A No, never. I mean, when he first -- the first  
2 year of medical school when he lived closer to  
3 school, he lived with a roommate named Mike.  
4 That's all I know. I didn't live with him. I  
5 lived in New Jersey at that time.

6 Q Do you know Mike's last name?

7 A Mike Green.

8 Q And was that in the Dorchester address?

9 A Yes. I don't think it was Dorchester. I think  
10 it might have been like Dorchester Ave. Is that  
11 close to here?

12 LT. DET. MERNER: Yeah. It could be  
13 Dorchester Ave.

14 MS. MCALLISTER: Yeah.

15 LT. DET. MERNER: For the record,  
16 Lieutenant Detective Merner.

17 BY LT. DET. MERNER:

18 Q For rent down there at Highpoint Circle, how  
19 much do you pay a month, do you know?

20 A 1400.

21 Q \$1400. How about other expenses?

22 A I don't take care of any of that because I don't  
23 have a job. I mean, we take out loans -- he  
24 takes out loans for everything. So it's I think



1 1400, plus just bills, and then food. And then,  
2 you know, I have some savings, which I spend on  
3 food, and that's it.

4 Q And what type of bills do you have that you're  
5 aware of?

6 A I'm not aware. Like, I don't handle any of that  
7 so I couldn't tell you.

8 Q I mean, have you ever seen an electric bill come  
9 to the house?

10 A Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah.

11 Q Electric bill, okay. Any other bills, cable?

12 A We have, like, Comcast, so it's the Internet,  
13 phone, and TV thing. They came once in August  
14 when we moved in, and that's it.

15 Q Do you have any idea how much that is a month,  
16 roughly. No?

17 A Uh-uh.

18 Q And how about cable?

19 A Maybe a hundred, maybe a little bit less than a  
20 hundred.

21 Q Okay. And how about vehicles? Do you have  
22 vehicles?

23 A His vehicle, and I have a Trailblazer, 2002.

24 It's dead right now. It's been dead for a month

1           since I -- last time I was in New Jersey, I was  
2           about to leave, and I went to go use my car and  
3           it was -- battery was dead, so I called AAA.  
4           They came. They ran it, and I didn't go right  
5           then to get a battery so it died the next day. I  
6           was going to go the next day and get a battery.

7                        So it's still sitting in the parking  
8           lot, because I just came back and we are going  
9           to, you know, deal with this today or tomorrow.

10       Q       Okay. So the student loans, did he take out  
11           student loans also to pay for his medical school  
12           as well or --

13       A       Yeah. Medical school, they give you loans for  
14           everything. They give you loans to live, for  
15           school. So, I mean, BU is expensive. They give  
16           -- you know, they give you. He's just going to  
17           have to pay all of that back.

18       Q       Okay.

19       BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

20       Q       And you said his vehicle's a what?

21       A       It's -- the Toyota, like, you pulled over. It  
22           was a Toyota Corolla. I think it's a 2002,  
23           also, silver.

24       Q       And what color is your Trailblazer?

1 A It's like a goldish silverish, champagne you'd  
2 call it, I guess.

3 Q Okay. And you say he takes care of the bills  
4 that come in?

5 A Yes.

6 Q The electric and the Comcast and -- do you have  
7 phone service?

8 A Yes.

9 Q Okay. And who do you have for phone service?

10 A That's the Comcast. It's the phone -- you mean  
11 a cellphone or --

12 Q No, no, the phone service. It's Comcast phone?

13 A Yeah, Comcast phone, TV and Internet we get,  
14 like a three package.

15 Q And who's name is that in? Is that in your name  
16 or --

17 A His name.

18 Q Okay. And so you have phone, TV and Internet?

19 A Mm-hmm.

20 Q Okay. How many computers do you have in the  
21 house?

22 A We have two laptops. Actually, he just bought a  
23 new one off of a student because his was -- I  
24 stepped on his. It was broken. So he has -- so

1           now we have a broken one and two.

2           Q       And when did he buy the new one?

3           A       A few days ago. I don't know. I wasn't here  
4           for the last month, so he just told me this when  
5           I got home.

6           Q       So he had two, and now he has a new one?

7           A       Mm-hmm.

8           Q       Because he broke one?

9           A       I broke it, yes. I stepped on it.

10          Q       When did you break it?

11          A       When did I break it? I stepped on it like two  
12          months ago, two, three months ago, and he's been  
13          using it, and then like there's black lines  
14          going all through it because I stepped on it,  
15          so.

16          Q       Did he throw it out when he got the new one?

17          A       I don't know. I think he still has it. It's  
18          still in our house, yeah, still in our  
19          apartment.

20          Q       And how do you hook up to the Internet with  
21          that? Do you use cables or Wi-Fi?

22          A       Yeah. Wireless router, I think.

23          Q       Okay. So you just came up here a few days ago?

24          A       Yes. Saturday night I came up here.

1 Q And that would have been what, the 18th?

2 A Mm-hmm, yeah, 18th, around 6:00 o'clock at  
3 night.

4 Q And you were heading back to New Jersey now?

5 A I was -- right now?

6 Q Yeah.

7 A We were going to Foxwoods today, just for the  
8 day.

9 Q Oh, I thought you said you were going to -- you  
10 were going to take care of the Trailblazer  
11 today, I thought you said.

12 A Yeah, we called AAA yesterday. They said they  
13 didn't have the battery so we could call them  
14 today or tomorrow. We decided to go to Foxwoods  
15 today since he didn't have school, and then we  
16 were going to call AAA tomorrow or whenever we  
17 got back to get the battery in my car.

18 Q Does he have to go to school later this week?

19 A Yeah. He goes to school every day.

20 Q Okay. How often do you go to Foxwoods?

21 A Every once in a while.

22 Q I don't know what every once in a while means.

23 A Maybe once a month, twice a month. We stay  
24 maybe a night or two and come home. Sometimes,

1           like, we're onto New Jersey. He'll come and  
2           pick me up and we'll stay, you know, on the way,  
3           since it breaks it up for me because I have back  
4           pain. So it kind of -- so we'll stay there for  
5           a night, and then drive back to Boston.

6       Q     Okay. Do you have a cellphone?

7       A     Yeah.

8       Q     What's that?

9       A     732-241-1316.

10      Q     I think we're already got that.

11     A     Yeah.

12     Q     And what's your boyfriend's cellphone?

13     A     Gosh, 315-569. -- I would have to look. I don't  
14           -- I don't, I don't memorize it because it's in  
15           my phone, so.

16     Q     It's in your phone.

17     A     Yeah, yes.

18     Q     Okay, all right. And you go down to Foxwoods  
19           once or twice a month?

20     A     Yeah.

21     Q     That's where you were heading today. How long  
22           were you going to spend down there?

23     A     Just the night, just tonight.

24     Q     And you're going to head back to Boston after

1           that?

2    A       Yeah.

3    Q       Or New Jersey?

4    A       Yeah, back to Boston, because he has school the  
5           rest of the week. Basically, he bought me shoes  
6           from there last time he was there and we were  
7           going to return them, and he was -- and we were  
8           just going to stay overnight because he got --  
9           he -- [inaudible] rooms, you know, every so  
10          often.

11                    LT. DET. MERNER: Does he get those  
12          rooms -- for the record, Lieutenant Merner.

13   BY LT. DET. MERNER:

14   Q       Does he get those rooms because he's like a  
15          preferred gambler or one of those types of  
16          things, like comps?

17   A       Umm, I guess. I mean, they say they send them  
18          to everybody just because it's been a slow year,  
19          so they're just trying to fill up the rooms. I  
20          mean, I think they send like my parents, you  
21          know --

22   Q       Right.

23   A       -- things in the mail. My parents have been  
24          there once in their life, so.

1 Q And you go down there about twice a month?

2 A Mm-hmm.

3 Q Do you play cards?

4 A I don't. I stay with him and watch him, but I  
5 don't -- I don't gamble at all.

6 Q And what does he play, usually?

7 A He plays blackjack, and like, that's it, for  
8 like a couple hours and then, you know, we have  
9 dinner, and then that's it. That's basically  
10 what we do there.

11 Q What kind of stakes? Any type of, you know --

12 A He has no money so he's -- he's, you know, not  
13 -- he's not gambling with a lot of money.

14 Q Small stakes?

15 A Yeah.

16 Q And when you're out of town, when you were out  
17 of town this past month, do you talk daily?

18 A Yeah, we talk a few times a day.

19 Q Okay. And is that on the phone from the house,  
20 cellphones?

21 A Usually the house phone. I usually call him  
22 from the house phone, and he's always at home.  
23 I mean --

24 Q How about texting?



1 A Texting, I text him.

2 Q Okay. And you're not sure of the number that  
3 you text. You just have them punched into your  
4 machine?

5 A Yeah, just Phil's, you know.

6 Q Okay. And as finances, how long has the  
7 financial situation been like this, where he  
8 just takes loans to basically live, since he  
9 started medical --

10 A Since he started medical school 'cause they  
11 don't -- you know, you can't have a job while  
12 you're in medical school, basically.

13 Q Right.

14 A I mean, this is how everyone lives. Either, you  
15 know, you have rich parents who pay for your  
16 medical school or you take out loans. That's  
17 basically what it is.

18 Q Okay. I take it he's the latter?

19 A Yeah.

20 Q And you're getting ready to go to medical school  
21 yourself?

22 A Yes.

23 Q When you did work, what did you do for work?

24 A I was a medical transcriptionist in a hospital

1 in New Jersey, and that was in 2007. That  
2 wasn't even for a whole year.

3 Q And that was where, in New Jersey?

4 A Yes.

5 Q You've never worked up here in Massachusetts at  
6 all?

7 A No, never.

8 Q Okay.

9 A I mean, I've been looking for jobs on Craigslist  
10 and whatnot, but haven't found anything, haven't  
11 even gotten, you know, answers from people.

12 Q Okay. And how about -- how about your  
13 boyfriend?

14 A He --

15 Q Prior to going to medical school, did he -- was  
16 he working anywhere or --

17 A No, no, because he went right from college  
18 undergraduate to --

19 Q To medical school?

20 A -- to medical school, so he did not work in  
21 between.

22 Q And where did he go to undergrad?

23 A University of Albany, SUNY Albany. We both went  
24 there.

1 Q And where you both went?

2 A Mm-hmm.

3 Q Is that where you met?

4 A Yeah.

5 Q How long have you been dating?

6 A It was my senior year, so I graduated in 2006,  
7 so it's been since 2005; three and a half, four  
8 years.

9 Q And so the rent is like 1400, food, cable, you  
10 have two vehicles. So we're talking somewhere  
11 in excess or in the area of -- I mean, would it  
12 be fair to say between 1500 and \$2,000 a month,  
13 just for basic living expenses?

14 A Mm-hmm.

15 Q And student loans covers all that?

16 A Mm-hmm. And like I said, like I have savings  
17 which are gone now which I used for food and  
18 stuff, you know, this past year.

19 Q And so on a day like when you go down to  
20 Foxwoods today, was the room that you were going  
21 to stay in complete -- excuse me, was the room  
22 that you were going to stay in completely  
23 comped or did you have to pay a nominal fee?

24 A No, \$79. They gave us --

1 Q \$79?

2 A Yeah, they would give us the \$79 rate. And then  
3 I mean, he has like a card at home that says,  
4 you know, you get a free room each week in May,  
5 you know, but I think a bunch of people get  
6 that. I don't know why.

7 Q So you were going to stay one night for \$79?

8 A Yeah.

9 Q You said you were looking for work on  
10 Craigslist.

11 A Mm-hmm.

12 Q Do you frequent Craigslist?

13 A I haven't done it since December because I've  
14 been concentrating on getting into medical  
15 schools so, I mean --

16 Q You haven't really been looking.

17 A So from this past December, and then like a year  
18 before that, I was looking. I was doing like --  
19 trying to find nanny jobs, stuff like that. I  
20 would like e-mail people or e-mail the  
21 Craigslist people, and I mean, I got maybe one  
22 or two people to call me back out of hundreds.

23 Q And so I'm a little bit older than you,  
24 obviously, so that Craigslist stuff is new to

1 me. How does that work? Do you apply for jobs  
2 right on Craigslist?

3 A There's people that -- it's like -- it's like a  
4 newspaper, classified ads online. So there's  
5 people who post jobs or whatever you're looking  
6 for, housing. You go and you click whatever you  
7 want. Like, I, you know, was searching for  
8 child care or something like that or something  
9 in the medical field.

10 So I would go and I would -- they would  
11 either have their e-mail or there would be a  
12 Craigslist e-mail, and the Craigslist e-mail  
13 would e-mail the person, you know, your  
14 response. So I would be, like, well, I'm  
15 interested in this job; here's my resume, and  
16 they would send it to them. But nobody, like I  
17 said, nobody got back to me, maybe one or two  
18 women did, and they were like, well, you know,  
19 you're not good enough, so.

20 SGT. DET. DUFF: Sergeant Detective Duff  
21 for the record.

22 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

23 Q Have you posted your resume on Craigslist?

24 A No, I didn't. No. I've sent them in e-mails to

1 people.

2 Q Okay.

3 A I haven't sent my resume to anybody in years,  
4 except for these like, these few women that I  
5 wanted to apply for nanny jobs. Like, I don't  
6 post it on Monster dot -- I don't post my  
7 resumes or anything like that.

8 Q Okay. Does anyone else visit him or live with  
9 him at all?

10 A No. I mean, I'm -- me and him, like we're  
11 together 24 hours a day. Like, there's --  
12 'cause during school, the professors, they put  
13 the lectures online. So technically, you don't  
14 have to go to class and sit in class. You can  
15 be at home and watch the lectures, which is what  
16 he does. So we're together all the time.

17 And whenever I'm at home in New Jersey,  
18 you know, this has been the longest time I've  
19 been in New Jersey this past month, and that was  
20 a month, and usually I'm just gone for a week or  
21 a few days. And when I am, I call him, and I  
22 call him on the home line and he's at home, you  
23 know. It's not like I'm calling him on his  
24 cellphone and he's, you know, somewhere --

1 Q All right.

2 A -- somewhere else.

3 Q So you were actually not in Quincy for the past  
4 month?

5 A Right.

6 Q And today is the 20th of April. So when was the  
7 last time you were in Quincy?

8 A My -- I think it was the 23rd, exactly. I had a  
9 doctor's appointment the 24th, so I think I went  
10 the day before, the 23rd.

11 Q And that's of February?

12 A Right.

13 Q March?

14 A February.

15 Q February?

16 A I've been gone until -- for a month. So this is  
17 the longest I've been gone.

18 Q So you've been in New Jersey since February  
19 23rd?

20 A February 24th, March, April. Wait, that doesn't  
21 make any sense. I haven't been gone for two  
22 months.

23 Q We're April 20th today. It's April 20th today.

24 A Okay, okay. So I'm sorry. So I was home

1 February 24th maybe for a few days, and then the  
2 next month, we're in March. So March, it was at  
3 the end of March that I came home. My  
4 appointment was -- it would have been a month  
5 from the 24th. So I think it was March 20th  
6 when I came home to New Jersey, March 20th, and  
7 then I came back now. So it was a month. I'm  
8 sorry, the February, yes.

9 Q Have you experienced any more financial trouble  
10 or has your fiance talked to you about  
11 experiencing any more financial trouble of late?  
12 Have things gotten easier? Has there been more  
13 money available?

14 A No.

15 Q No?

16 A No, not at all.

17 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

18 Q Okay. I think I asked you, no one else lives  
19 with you. You both basically live in that  
20 apartment, correct?

21 A Right.

22 Q But you spend at least some portion of your time  
23 in New Jersey?

24 A Yeah.



1 Q Okay. And no one else lives with your fiance.  
2 Does he have any roommates or former roommates  
3 or best friends that like crash there or hang  
4 out there or --

5 A No, we never have friends over, ever. I mean,  
6 like, since we've moved to Boston, you know, we  
7 don't have any group of friends that we hang out  
8 with. He has, like, a few friends from medical  
9 school which he sees, you know, very rarely.  
10 That's it. I mean, we've never had any friends  
11 come over to our apartment, ever. Like that --  
12 I mean, basically maybe, you know, just family  
13 members.

14 Q Does your family come up to visit a lot?

15 A No. My -- his mother has come up once or twice.  
16 His father has come up a couple of times and my  
17 parents came up once, but other than that, if we  
18 were to go out with friends, we would meet them  
19 out in Boston somewhere and, you know, go out to  
20 dinner or something like that.

21 I mean, the money thing, I don't know  
22 why you're asking me if it has gotten easier,  
23 but it's been tough this whole time. It's been  
24 like, you know, we're living dollar to dollar

1 'cause they don't -- they're not going to give  
2 you more money than -- he's taking out the  
3 maximum amount of loans and that's, you know,  
4 like we -- like, we were only going to get this  
5 apartment that's at 8 Highpoint in Quincy if I  
6 got a job, then I never ended up getting a job  
7 'cause no one responded to me, and so it's been  
8 really hard. So he's been taking out the  
9 maximum amount of loans, so it's been very  
10 difficult.

11 BY LT. DET. MERNER:

12 Q Has that added to the stress of the situation?  
13 Is it, I mean, financial stress is hitting  
14 everybody, but I mean --

15 A Yeah, I mean, not really because, I mean, you  
16 know, he's been dealing with it for two years,  
17 you know. We do what we can do, and we'll --  
18 you know, eventually we'll have money and we'll  
19 pay them back, you know.

20 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

21 Q You moved into that apartment when, August --

22 A I think -- I think I was August. He might have  
23 been the end of July.

24 Q And that was of '08?

1 A Yes.

2 Q Excuse me?

3 A Yeah.

4 Q And he moved in around July of '08?

5 A Yes, I think that's -- the end of July. We  
6 moved in about two weeks apart from each other.

7 Q And when he was living in Boston in  
8 Dorchester --

9 A I don't think it was Dorchester. I think it was  
10 like South Boston or Dorchester Ave., but it  
11 wasn't Dorchester.

12 Q Do you know what T station was near there?

13 A It was the Red Line. He was like walking  
14 distance. There was like a big intersection,  
15 you know, like a four or five-way intersection  
16 and there's the Red Line right there. He lived  
17 on that --

18 Q Is there a Dunkin' Donuts there?

19 A Yes. He lived right down that street, but it  
20 was a very bad area.

21 BY LT. DET. MERNER:

22 Q Does Andrews Station sound familiar?

23 A Yeah.

24 Q So it's right near Andrews?

1 A Right, right there, Andrews Square. That's --  
2 he was like right down the street from Andrews  
3 Square on that -- and he had a roommate. That  
4 was his roommate, Mike Green, so I don't know.

5 Q What does Mike do for work?

6 A Mike goes to graduate school, not medical school  
7 but like he's a Ph.D. student, so they -- he  
8 goes to the same school, so that they don't have  
9 a job. They don't have jobs. I mean, he's on  
10 loans. I think he actually gets paid. I think  
11 Ph.D. students get paid to go to school, so.

12 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

13 Q Okay. And how long did he live in Andrews  
14 Square before he moved to Quincy?

15 A A year. I mean, for however long he was in  
16 school for, medical school --

17 Q And when --

18 A -- that year before.

19 Q So he started in what, '06?

20 A No. He graduated undergraduate in 2007 May, and  
21 then he moved in that summer, so June, July,  
22 August. I don't know when he moved in, but he  
23 moved in probably August, and then he started  
24 school in August of '07.

1 Q Okay. When he lived in Boston, did he also have  
2 Comcast, phone, Internet, data, cable, all that?

3 A Yeah.

4 Q Did he have the same phone number; did he take  
5 the phone number with him?

6 A No, he did not, no. He got the new phone  
7 number.

8 Q And you got the new phone number when you moved  
9 to Quincy?

10 A We weren't going to get one. We were just going  
11 to use our cellphones, but we don't get good  
12 cellphone reception in our apartment, so we  
13 ended up getting a phone a couple months I think  
14 after Comcast -- after the Internet thing.

15 Q Okay. So that would have been in --

16 A I'm not completely positive, but I just remember  
17 that we were just going to use our cellphones  
18 and that may have come a little bit later.

19 Q And he moved in Quincy around July of '08 or  
20 August of '08 you said?

21 A Right.

22 Q Could it have been earlier than that?

23 A Moved in Highpoint Circle?

24 Q Yeah.

- 1 A Earlier than July?
- 2 Q Yeah.
- 3 A I don't think so, no. No. I think we got -- I  
4 think we have to move out by this July so I  
5 think we got it, 'cause I remember he wanted it  
6 as close as possible from the move-out date of  
7 his other apartment. I think it was the end of  
8 July, and I think I moved in like a week or two  
9 later in August.
- 10 Q You moved in what, a week or two later?
- 11 A After him.
- 12 Q Okay.
- 13 A In August.
- 14 Q Do you remember what his phone number was when  
15 he lived in Boston?
- 16 A No, I have no idea.
- 17 Q Whose name was that under?
- 18 A Actually, actually, you know what? They didn't  
19 even have -- I don't think they had a phone. I  
20 think they just used their cellphones. They  
21 might have not even had a land line, to tell you  
22 the truth. I think they just had the Internet  
23 and the TV. It wasn't Comcast. They didn't  
24 have a phone line, because I -- yeah, I never

1           called him on the land line, so no, he didn't  
2           have a phone line, sorry.

3       Q     Just when you talk about looking for work on  
4            Craigslis, have you ever posted any other type  
5            of activity on Craigslis?

6       A     The only -- I've never posted anything. I've  
7            just responded to things. So it's like, if a  
8            woman is posting, you know, I want a nanny for  
9            my three children, I'll, you know, e-mail her;  
10          this is my resume, and that was a few times, so  
11          that's it. I don't post anything myself. I  
12          respond to people.

13       BY LT. DET. MERNER:

14       Q     Do you know if Philip has posted anything?

15       A     Oh, no, no, no, no. No, no.

16       Q     No?

17       A     He doesn't go on Craigslis.

18       Q     He doesn't?

19       A     No.

20       Q     He wouldn't have, like --

21       A     I mean, he would -- he is not -- he doesn't --  
22            he's not going to find work or anything, you  
23            know.

24       Q     But would he have, like, maybe an old stereo,

1 he's getting an iPod. Would he post it to sell  
2 or --

3 A No.

4 Q Or his old broken computer?

5 A He's not going to sell his old, broken computer  
6 to anybody, no.

7 Q Someone might fix it.

8 A Yeah. I don't think so, no.

9 Q No?

10 A No.

11 Q Okay. And do you know if anyone else has ever  
12 used your phone?

13 A And I mean, he tells me everything. He would  
14 probably tell me, you know, I'm posting my  
15 computer on Craigslist, so, something like that.

16 Q Has anyone ever used your address or phone  
17 number? Any friends from out of town ever used  
18 your address or your phone number when they, you  
19 know, come here or anything like that that  
20 you're aware of?

21 A I don't think -- I mean, I don't think many  
22 people know our address, but we did send like --  
23 we're having a wedding in August so we did send  
24 save-the-dates out, so we put our return address



1 on everybody's envelope.

2 Q Right.

3 A All of our family, that's like a hundred people,  
4 so.

5 Q How about your cell -- how about your home  
6 number?

7 A Our home number? I have given it to people.  
8 It's actually been a crazy number because this  
9 one day, we were getting cellphone calls every  
10 five minutes, like Massachusetts cellphone,  
11 very, very sketchy all day, and we also all the  
12 time get random calls from people, and we  
13 just --

14 Q Into the home?

15 A Into -- on our land line. And it's just an  
16 awful phone, and, you know, we get lots of, you  
17 know, it's --

18 Q What kind of sketchy calls?

19 A This one -- this one person keeps calling. He  
20 sounds not right, like mentally not right, and  
21 he, you know, he's like jibber-jabber kind of  
22 talking, and it's happened a few times.

23 Then there was one day and every five  
24 minutes, we would get a different cellphone. It

1 would be -- say, you know, Massachusetts  
2 cellphone number, and it would be like every  
3 five minutes and it would be a different  
4 Massachusetts cellphone number, and they'd be  
5 calling every -- and we, you know, just stopped  
6 picking up. And we, like, finally, I just said  
7 stop calling and, you know --

8 Q Were they asking for anything, saying anything?  
9 What would be the --

10 A They were like asking for somebody, some random  
11 person. I don't even -- he might remember the  
12 person's name that they were asking for. We get  
13 -- I mean, we get like calls all the time asking  
14 for so-and-so, you know, is so-and-so there? Is  
15 so-and-so there? You know, and some of these --

16 Q And you say sketchy? What do you mean by  
17 sketchy? I mean --

18 A Well, like, there's this one -- yeah. There's  
19 this one guy who's called a bunch of times  
20 asking for somebody, and he's like, you know, he  
21 sounds not right. He sounds like, you know,  
22 mentally impaired, you know, saying, you know,  
23 is mom there? You know, give me mom; like, put  
24 mom on the phone, and he'll start cursing and

1           swearing and, you know, like that. And it's  
2           happened a few times, and we'll say, you know,  
3           don't -- you know, stop calling, and, you know,  
4           sometimes we just don't answer it, and it's from  
5           different numbers.

6       Q     Do any of the calls have any -- any content of a  
7           threatening nature or sexual nature or anything  
8           like that?

9       A     Not that I know of. I mean, some people sounded  
10          like, I can't really make out what they're  
11          saying, so they can. But we do get, I mean, an  
12          abundance of -- this one day, it was just  
13          cellphone -- every five minutes was a different  
14          cellphone number, which was very strange, and  
15          I'm like, we should do something about this.  
16          Shouldn't we, you know, call the Comcast or  
17          something?

18                   And he was like, no, don't worry about  
19                   it. And then the next day, nothing happened.  
20                   It was just like --

21       Q     How long ago was that, the last time?

22       A     I'd say about a month, a month and a half ago, a  
23           month ago. The last time, before I left for New  
24           Jersey, yeah.

1 Q Okay.

2 A But ever since we got this line, there were  
3 people calling all the time, just random  
4 cellphone numbers; like, I think someone was  
5 asking for a nail salon, like -- I don't, you  
6 know, just -- it was like a bad number to have.  
7 We wanted to change it right away.

8 Q You said it kind of annoyed you that you kept  
9 getting these calls.

10 A Mm-hmm.

11 Q But your boyfriend just said, kind of don't  
12 worry about it. Did he seem to take it in  
13 stride?

14 A Well, he's like that. I mean, he's like, he's  
15 like maybe we should call Comcast or something,  
16 but we never ended up doing that; or he's just  
17 like, you know, just don't answer it or, you  
18 know, pick it up and tell them stop calling, you  
19 know, or just stop answering. He just, you  
20 know, kind of blew it off, like, don't answer  
21 them anymore, because I'm getting mad. I'm  
22 wanting to pick up and yell at these people, and  
23 he's just like, you know, just don't get worried  
24 about it.

1 Q At any time --

2 A I mean, it bothers him a lot, too. Ever since  
3 the beginning, he's like this is -- this is the  
4 most awful telephone number we've gotten, like,  
5 you know, not just solicitors. It's people  
6 calling, like crazy people.

7 Q In the last few weeks while you were away, you  
8 know, has Phil told you he's run into any kind  
9 of problems with anything, either illegal or any  
10 otherwise?

11 A Uh-uh.

12 Q Has he seemed the same in the past couple of  
13 days since you've been with him?

14 A Yeah.

15 Q He's never mentioned any activity, that he's had  
16 any problem with anyone legally or with the  
17 police or anything like that?

18 A No. Can I ask what happened, what this is all  
19 about or --

20 Q Well, we'd like to get a little more background  
21 first. Within the past few days, was there any  
22 point of time where you had difficulty getting  
23 in touch with him?

24 A No.

1 Q Okay. And he was always available by cellphone  
2 or --

3 A Our home phone.

4 Q Do you text message a lot?

5 A Yeah.

6 Q Okay.

7 A I mean, we're text messaging all the time and --

8 Q Excuse me.

9 A We text message all the time when I'm in New  
10 Jersey, and I call him several times a day, so.

11 Q Okay. And does he just have one cellphone that  
12 he text messages from or --

13 A He has one cellphone.

14 Q He doesn't have like a work phone or anything  
15 like that?

16 A Uh-uh.

17 Q What kind of cellphone is that?

18 A It's a Verizon Blackberry one.

19 Q Does it look like a regular Blackberry, like one  
20 of these or --

21 A No. It's like the smaller ones, the new ones,  
22 like the touch screen. Verizon has like a new  
23 one. They're smaller and they're --

24 Q Does it open or something?

1 A No, I don't think so. I don't think so. I  
2 think it just has like a touch screen.

3 Q Does he get e-mail over that, too?

4 A Yeah, e-mail comes through that, yes.

5 Q Besides text messages?

6 A E-mail. Every time he gets an e-mail, it comes  
7 to the Blackberry so he can check his e-mail.

8 Q So he can get his home e-mail on his Blackberry.  
9 Do you know what his e-mail address is?

10 A Phil.Markoff@gmail.com.

11 Q It's not Philip, it's just Phil?

12 A Phil.Markoff@gmail.

13 Q At gmail?

14 A Yeah.

15 Q And no one comes over to the apartment to use  
16 his computer to do any work or schoolwork or  
17 anything like that?

18 A Uh-uh. But like I said, this new computer was  
19 sold from -- he bought it from a different  
20 student so I don't know if that has anything to  
21 do what, you know, you're asking, but no one  
22 that I know uses his computer. I mean, he's  
23 home most of the day. It's just him.

24 Q And when did he buy this computer?

1 A The new one?

2 Q Yeah.

3 A I think in the past week or two while I was  
4 gone. I don't know. He just told me. He said  
5 he had to -- 'cause his old one, which I stepped  
6 on, has black lines running through it, and he  
7 said it got to the point where he can't even see  
8 the screen, so.

9 Q Okay. What kind of computer is that that he has  
10 now, do you know?

11 A The new one?

12 Q Yeah.

13 A It's a Dell Inspiron. I don't think it's that  
14 great, he said.

15 Q What was the old one?

16 A Gosh, I don't know. I forget.

17 Q You don't know if it was like a Compaq or an HP  
18 or --

19 A No.

20 Q A Mac?

21 A It wasn't an HP. It wasn't a Mac or an HP.

22 Q It wasn't a Compaq?

23 A Hmm. What are some of the other ones?

24 Q I'm not a really big computer guy.



1 A I don't know, I don't know.

2 Q There's -- I don't know if it's Acor or Acer,  
3 that's kind one of the little budget ones, I  
4 think.

5 The one that's broken is still -- it's  
6 at your house?

7 A I don't know. I don't know what he did with it,  
8 I mean.

9 Can I ask what this is about yet or no?

10 Q Sure.

11 A Okay.

12 Q We're investigating some activity from a  
13 computer in your house for online massage  
14 services.

15 A Online massage services?

16 Q Yes. Someone's accessed a computer in your  
17 home.

18 A There have been calls asking, you know how I  
19 said about the nail salon?

20 Q Mm-hmm.

21 A There have been calls from that guy saying, you  
22 know, massage, like, can I schedule a massage,  
23 massage and nail service? We've gotten calls  
24 like that.

1 Q That's the kind of -- that's the question that I  
2 asked you. Were any of the calls explicit  
3 either, you know, threatening in nature or --

4 A These were just like three or four times, no.  
5 Just like, oh, can I schedule a massage?  
6 Something like that.

7 Q And how long ago was that?

8 A Months ago.

9 Q Months ago?

10 A Yeah.

11 Q Two months ago, three months ago, six months  
12 ago, ten months ago?

13 A Four months ago. I mean, what kind of -- from  
14 his computer are you saying, or my computer? I  
15 mean, I get massages. I book massages all the  
16 time because I have a bad back. I mean, that's  
17 what I -- I do, like, you know, twice a month I  
18 get massages.

19 Q And where do you get them?

20 A All over the place. I've gotten them at  
21 Foxwoods when we go there. I've gotten them,  
22 you know, spas around here. I get them in New  
23 Jersey.

24 Q But always at like a beauty salon, a health spa,

1 something of that nature, right?

2 A Mm-hmm, right.

3 Q You don't call up --

4 A No, no, nobody comes over, you know, sets up a  
5 massage table, no.

6 Q Nor do you go to any --

7 A No. And he's never gotten a massage in his  
8 life.

9 Q Do you book those appointments over your  
10 computer or do you call?

11 A I usually -- I usually call.

12 Q And when you're here, what places would you  
13 call?

14 A I'm here --

15 Q When you're in Quincy?

16 A Every time I've went to a different place. I  
17 don't think I've gotten that many. Usually when  
18 I go home to New Jersey I get them there, and  
19 I've gotten them at Foxwoods a bunch of times,  
20 but that's it.

21 Q Do you remember any of the places that you've  
22 called from here?

23 A Allure Day Spa.

24 Q Allure, A-L --

1 A No, I didn't even get a massage there. I think  
2 that was just hair. I don't even remember. I  
3 couldn't tell you. I'm sorry. I mean, if I  
4 remember I could at least call you.

5 Q So weird activity, calling massages --

6 A I mean, I don't -- I looked up like massage  
7 therapy on my computer like in the Internet  
8 search just to find a good massage therapist,  
9 but I haven't booked anything online.

10 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

11 Q And when you look those up, does it just come  
12 back with web pages or does it link to  
13 Craigslist or how does that work?

14 A I don't do anything from -- massage and  
15 Craigslist don't really go together, so. I  
16 would be like looking at spas. Like, I would,  
17 like, Google, like, spa in Quincy, and then I  
18 would click on the link and it would, you know,  
19 tell me about those, the massage, basically.  
20 But like I said, I don't really get massages in  
21 this area because I haven't, you know --

22 BY LT. DET. MERNER:

23 Q And you've never been involved in any type of  
24 massage industry?

1 A No, no.

2 Q No, it's a question --

3 A Yeah, I know.

4 Q So somebody wouldn't be calling you for  
5 massages?

6 A No, no, no. But I told you, this guy did call,  
7 and I think maybe the number used on be part of  
8 like a nail salon or something like that,  
9 because the guy asked about a massage and then  
10 someone else called and asked about nail --  
11 nails. But I did tell Phil, I'm like, this guy  
12 just asked about, you know, he wants a massage,  
13 so it was very strange. So is that -- could  
14 that be it?

15 Q But I mean, you've never been involved in  
16 anything and Philip's never been involved in any  
17 type of message therapy --

18 A No, no.

19 Q -- or, you know --

20 A No. He's never even gotten a massage, so, no.

21 I mean, could that person who has been  
22 calling be part of that, I mean, from my number?

23 Q That's what we're trying too find out.

24

1 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

2 Q What's the phone number, the land line, your  
3 apartment?

4 A 617 -- I don't know. I need my cellphone to --  
5 617 --

6 Q We'll figure that out.

7 A I don't know. I can't remember phone numbers,  
8 I'm sorry. He knows it. Phil knows it.

9 LT. DET. MERNER: Can I just pause this  
10 for a second. My pen ran out of ink. I'm  
11 going to go grab another pen. Shut that off.

12 SGT. DET. DUFF: We're going to pause  
13 this for one second. It's 3:46 p.m.

14 LT. DET. MERNER: Do you want with a  
15 glass of water or --

16 [Break in proceedings.]

17 SGT. DET. DUFF: Okay. It is 3:55 p.m.  
18 by my watch, Sergeant Dan Duff. We're back in  
19 the room now.

20 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

21 Q Megan, I asked you if you wanted a glass of  
22 water. You declined, right?

23 A Right.

24 Q Are you sure you don't want a glass?

1 A I'm sure.

2 BY LT. DET. MERNER:

3 Q And it's fair to say, Megan, that --

4 LT. DET. MERNER: This is Lieutenant  
5 Detective Merner for the record again.

6 Q It's fair to say that during the break you went  
7 to the bathroom, one of the female officers  
8 walked you down to the bathroom?

9 A Yeah.

10 Q And we told you that, you know, you've asked us  
11 a couple of times kind of what it's about and  
12 we're kind of explaining to you that there's  
13 some activity we believe that emanated from your  
14 apartment relative to computer activity,  
15 correct?

16 A Ah-huh. I mean, how do you know it's from our  
17 apartment? Could it be just through a Comcast,  
18 through, you know, any computer or?

19 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

20 Q It's something that we fall back as best as we  
21 can, and you have a Comcast account, correct?

22 A Right.

23 Q And that's in Philip's name?

24 A Right.

1 Q And having a computer account is like having a  
2 phone number. There's a number assigned to you.

3 A Right.

4 Q Do you know anything about computers?

5 A Not really.

6 Q There's a thing called an Internet protocol  
7 address.

8 A Yeah.

9 Q It's like your computer's phone number.

10 A Yeah.

11 Q And every account, every person who has an  
12 account has an ID number.

13 A Right. Now, can people, you know, like hack  
14 into that? You know, like, people do that with  
15 computers all the time, because from my  
16 understanding.

17 Q I don't think they can hack into it so much as  
18 theoretically, someone could access it from  
19 somewhere else, but we have a static number  
20 which is your fiance's --

21 A I mean, could it be our phone number that --  
22 that's --

23 Q No, no it's your IP address.

24 A Oh.



1 BY LT. DET. MERNER:

2 Q What we can tell you is that someone has  
3 accessed -- someone has accessed Craigslist from  
4 your apartment --

5 SGT. DET. DUFF: Actually let me clarify  
6 that.

7 MS. MCALLISTER: Okay.

8 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

9 Q Someone's accessed an e-mail account from the IP  
10 address associated with your apartment.

11 A Mm-hmm.

12 Q And made some e-mails to someone --

13 A Mm-hmm.

14 BY LT. DET. MERNER:

15 Q -- that set up a date, okay. And what I'm going  
16 to do is I'm going to ask you to look at a  
17 picture and see if you recognize the individual  
18 in the picture.

19 A Where is this?

20 Q I'm not asking where it is. I'm asking you if  
21 you recognize the individual in the picture.

22 A That looks like Phil.

23 Q That looks like Phil?

24 A Yes.

1 Q Okay. And I'm going to ask you to look at  
2 another picture. Who is that?

3 A I cannot tell.

4 Q Okay. Does it look like anyone you recognize?

5 A It could look like a lot of people I recognize.

6 Q How about that one there?

7 A That may be Phil; it may not. I mean, that guy  
8 looks heavier than Phil.

9 Q Okay. And just looking at some --

10 A It's -- those aren't his shoes, either.

11 Q Okay. How about the jacket? Does Phil own a  
12 leather jacket that resembles that?

13 A Yeah.

14 Q Pardon?

15 A Yes.

16 Q Okay. And have you seen Phil with that leather  
17 jacket on recently?

18 A He wears it.

19 Q Okay. And when you looked at that picture  
20 there, the first one, you said it looks like  
21 Phil, is that correct?

22 A Mm-hmm.

23 Q Okay.

24 SGT. DET. DUFF: Can we just note which

1 ones and which times, which photos?

2 LT. DET. MERNER: Yeah. I'm going to  
3 look at the first one that you said looks like  
4 Phil is a photo that is listed as --

5 SGT. DET. DUFF: Camera 264.

6 LT. DET. MERNER: Camera 264, and it has  
7 a date on it of 4/14/09 at 10:06, it looks like  
8 44, is that fair to say?

9 MS. MCALLISTER: Mm-hmm.

10 LT. DET. MERNER: It's got a little  
11 green dot and it's -- it's encased in a --

12 SGT. DET. DUFF: Sheet protector.

13 LT. DET. MERNER: -- sheet protector,  
14 correct?

15 MS. MCALLISTER: Mm-hmm.

16 LT. DET. MERNER: The second photo that  
17 I had you look at is a photo -- the best way to  
18 identify it is it has a sign on it that says --  
19 look likes it says Haru, H-A-R-U, correct?

20 MS. MCALLISTER: Mm-hmm.

21 LT. DET. MERNER: And a person getting  
22 on an escalator. And you said it -- that's the  
23 one that looks like a lot of people, is that  
24 correct?

1 MS. MCALLISTER: Mm-hmm.

2 LT. DET. MERNER: And the last photo  
3 that I've asked you to look at is camera 264,  
4 4/14/09, and it looks like it says  
5 10:06:45 p.m., correct? And you stated that  
6 that looks like Phil.

7 MS. MCALLISTER: When was the 14th?  
8 What day was that? Was that last week?

9 SGT. DET. DUFF: That was last week on  
10 Tuesday.

11 LT. DET. MERNER: Tuesday night. So you  
12 believe that that person in photo No. 1 looks  
13 just like Phil, is that correct? And you can  
14 take it out of the sheet protector if the glare  
15 bothers you.

16 MS. MCALLISTER: It looks similar, but  
17 he does not have those shoes, and then that guy  
18 looks heavier.

19 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay.

20 MS. MCALLISTER: And that --

21 LT. DET. MERNER: He does have that  
22 jacket?

23 MS. MCALLISTER: He has a similar  
24 leather jacket. He does have a leather jacket.

1 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay.

2 MS. MCALLISTER: But those aren't his  
3 shoes.

4 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. And can you  
5 tell what kind of shoes those are in the photo?

6 MS. MCALLISTER: They just look like big  
7 black -- I don't know. They don't look like  
8 shoes he has.

9 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay.

10 MS. MCALLISTER: I know, you know, all  
11 of his shoes. He wears New Balance sneakers  
12 99 percent of the time.

13 SGT. DET. DUFF: Does he own a pair of  
14 shoes like that that he just doesn't wear?

15 MS. MCALLISTER: Not that I know of.

16 SGT. DET. DUFF: Not that you know of?

17 MS. MCALLISTER: No.

18 LT. DET. MERNER: I'll show you one  
19 other --

20 MS. MCALLISTER: Can I ask you where  
21 that was, though?

22 LT. DET. MERNER: Yeah, we'll get to  
23 that. Can I just ask you to look at one other  
24 photo? This is a photo outside. It's camera

1           222 outside of a T station. Does that  
2 individual look familiar to you?

3           MS. MCALLISTER: It looks a little bit  
4 like him.

5           LT. DET. MERNER: Okay.

6           MS. MCALLISTER: Not exactly, no. That  
7 -- he looks heavier.

8           LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. And is it -- if  
9 the photo was more clear, like if you, this is  
10 obviously a photo that's taken off of some type  
11 of a digital image.

12          MS. MCALLISTER: Mm-hmm.

13          LT. DET. MERNER: If the photo was  
14 clearer, do you think that might help you?

15          MS. MCALLISTER: No.

16          LT. DET. MERNER: It wouldn't help you?

17          MS. MCALLISTER: No. I mean, that looks  
18 heavier than Phil, so I don't know.

19          LT. DET. MERNER: And then I just have  
20 one more I'm going to ask you to look at. This  
21 one is dated 4/14/09 at 10:04. It says camera  
22 12, and I'd just ask you if you can look at  
23 that photo.

24                   [Pause.]

1                   SGT. DET. DUFF:  You've looked at the  
2 photo.  I noticed you kind of made a little  
3 face, for lack of a better term.

4                   MS. MCALLISTER:  Yeah.  Well, the hair  
5 looks different, so I don't know.  Where was  
6 that again, did you say?  At a T station?

7                   LT. DET. MERNER:  Well, the last one was  
8 at a T station.

9                   SGT. DET. DUFF:  No, the last one was  
10 not at a T station.

11                   LT. DET. MERNER:  The last one was  
12 inside the lobby of a -- of a hotel.

13                   MS. MCALLISTER:  Oh, okay.  The  
14 Marriott?

15                   LT. DET. MERNER:  Yes.

16                   MS. MCALLISTER:  Which Marriott was  
17 that?

18                   LT. DET. MERNER:  The Marriott in  
19 Boston.

20                   MS. MCALLISTER:  Oh, okay.

21                   LT. DET. MERNER:  Copley Square.  Had  
22 you seen any of these photos?  Have you been  
23 watching the news the last couple of days at  
24 all?

1 MS. MCALLISTER: No.

2 LT. DET. MERNER: Have you read any of  
3 the Boston newspapers?

4 MS. MCALLISTER: No, because I've been  
5 in New Jersey so --

6 LT. DET. MERNER: You've been back since  
7 --

8 MS. MCALLISTER: Oh, oh, the guy -- my  
9 mom actually told me there's a guy, you know,  
10 going around and -- to hotels.

11 LT. DET. MERNER: Right.

12 MS. MCALLISTER: Right.

13 LT. DET. MERNER: So what I'm asking you  
14 is, is we're following a lead, you know, from  
15 the IP address in your apartment, okay, that  
16 made a date with an individual at a hotel, and  
17 then the first photo I showed you is an  
18 individual at that hotel, who showed up at that  
19 time that the date was made. And you told me  
20 that it looks like Phil, is that correct?

21 MS. MCALLISTER: Mm-hmm.

22 LT. DET. MERNER: If I showed you that  
23 picture on a digital image that was somewhat  
24 more clear, would that help you?



1 MS. MCALLISTER: It might.

2 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. Would you be  
3 willing to look at that on a computer, if I  
4 showed you on a digital image?

5 MS. MCALLISTER: Sure. I mean, so what  
6 does this massage therapist have to do with the  
7 guy killing people, killing the women?

8 LT. DET. MERNER: Well, there's -- there  
9 hasn't been women killed, okay. There's only  
10 been one person killed.

11 MS. MCALLISTER: And it was a massage  
12 therapist, you said? Or no?

13 SGT. DET. DUFF: No, we didn't say that.

14 LT. DET. MERNER: We didn't say that.

15 MS. MCALLISTER: Oh.

16 LT. DET. MERNER: When we asked you,  
17 what I asked you, for the record, it's  
18 Lieutenant Merner. I had asked you about any  
19 -- you told me that you had got some prank  
20 calls into your apartment. I asked you if any  
21 of those calls were either threatening or  
22 sexual or anything else in nature, and you said  
23 that there were none like that, that there was  
24 a person that appeared to be mentally unstable,

1 correct?

2 MS. MCALLISTER: Right.

3 LT. DET. MERNER: And then I asked you  
4 if there had been any calls relative to massage  
5 or anything like that, and you said, well, you  
6 know, there were a couple of calls that people  
7 started asking for massage, which, you know, is  
8 kind of a strange call at one's house.

9 MS. MCALLISTER: Yeah. And that and the  
10 nail thing, I mean.

11 LT. DET. MERNER: And the nail thing.

12 MS. MCALLISTER: Yeah.

13 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. And then you  
14 asked us basically why you're here. We told  
15 you that a --

16 SGT. DET. DUFF: An e-mail was sent.

17 LT. DET. MERNER: -- an e-mail was sent  
18 from an IP address in your apartment, okay, to  
19 set up an appointment with a masseuse at a  
20 local hotel, and the timeframe of that  
21 appointment coincides with these surveillance  
22 photos of the individual.

23 MS. MCALLISTER: Okay. And who's the  
24 masseuse? Is she --

1                   LT. DET. MERNER: That's -- that's  
2 something that we'll get to the bottom -- we're  
3 trying to get to the bottom of.

4                   MS. MCALLISTER: Okay.

5                   LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. But, you know,  
6 at this point we showed you some surveillance  
7 photos and you believe it looks like Phil in  
8 the photo, all right.

9                   SGT. DET. DUFF: So coincidentally,  
10 there's someone at this hotel at the time of  
11 the appointment who looks like Phil, and it  
12 appears that the appointment was made from the  
13 computer in your apartment. That's kind of a  
14 big coincidence, wouldn't you agree with me?

15                   MS. MCALLISTER: Yes. I mean, could  
16 there have been a million guys, you know,  
17 going --

18                   LT. DET. MERNER: I guess our question  
19 is, has Phil mentioned anything to you about  
20 having any problems? Like, when the police  
21 went to pull you over today on the highway, did  
22 Phil say anything to you?

23                   MS. MCALLISTER: No. He was scared to  
24 death. He was like, oh, my God, what's

1           happening, what's happening, just as I was, you  
2           know.

3                   LT. DET. MERNER:   And the last thing I'm  
4           just going to show you is just a composite  
5           sketch that was made up.  Do you recognize that  
6           individual?  Does that look like anybody you  
7           know?

8                   MS. MCALLISTER:   No.

9                   LT. DET. MERNER:   Doesn't look like  
10          anybody?

11                  MS. MCALLISTER:   No.

12                  LT. DET. MERNER:   Okay.  And that's a  
13          composite sketch labeled LS 4/17/09.  Okay.

14                  So Phil has never mentioned to you that  
15          he's called for any type of massage service or  
16          made any e-mail accounts from any type of  
17          massage service?  And he's never mentioned to  
18          you that he's been to any of the Boston hotels  
19          such as the Marriott Copley?

20                  MS. MCALLISTER:   Uh-uh.

21                  LT. DET. MERNER:   I'm sorry, the tape  
22          won't pick up.

23                  MS. MCALLISTER:   No, no.

24                  LT. DET. MERNER:   Okay.  And when you

1           were pulled over today, he never mentioned  
2           anything to you about the police?

3                   MS. MCALLISTER:  No, no.  He was scared  
4           to death.  He was scared to death.  He said,  
5           what is -- he said, what's happening?  
6           Basically, we turned to each other and said,  
7           what is happening?  I mean, we're still scared  
8           to death, obviously.

9                   LT. DET. MERNER:  Okay.  And the other  
10          thing is, you said you were willing to look at  
11          a digital picture because obviously, these are  
12          -- we print them off a computer and it's like  
13          the kind of printing off your computer at home.

14                   MS. MCALLISTER:  Mm-hmm.

15                   LT. DET. MERNER:  If we brought you to  
16          -- over to a computer and popped in a disc and  
17          let you look at a digital picture, do you think  
18          that might enable you to say one way or  
19          another?

20                   MS. MCALLISTER:  I think those pictures  
21          were fine.

22                   LT. DET. MERNER:  They're fine.

23                   MS. MCALLISTER:  Yeah.

24                   LT. DET. MERNER:  And they look like

1 Phil?

2 MS. MCALLISTER: Some of them do; some  
3 of them don't. I don't think he has those  
4 shoes.

5 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay.

6 MS. MCALLISTER: That guy looked  
7 heavier. That hair looked longer, so I don't  
8 know.

9 LT. DET. MERNER: Would you prefer not  
10 to look at the digital pictures?

11 MS. MCALLISTER: Yeah. I --

12 LT. DET. MERNER: You don't want to?

13 MS. MCALLISTER: No, I don't want to.

14 SGT. DET. DUFF: And just for the  
15 record, some of those photos had a time on them  
16 of April 14th, '09, at about a little past  
17 10:00 p.m. You weren't in the Boston or Quincy  
18 area at that time, were you?

19 MS. MCALLISTER: I was in New Jersey  
20 last week.

21 SGT. DET. DUFF: In New Jersey.

22 MS. MCALLISTER: But I -- I can look on  
23 my phone to see if there's text messages or  
24 phone calls to him or the home.

1                   LT. DET. MERNER: And just to kind of  
2 bring Sergeant Duff's question into line,  
3 you've been in New Jersey for about a month,  
4 correct?

5                   MS. MCALLISTER: Correct, a little bit  
6 less than a month maybe.

7                   LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. And at least  
8 when you left a month ago, you never saw Phil  
9 wearing those type of shoes, would that be fair  
10 to say?

11                   MS. MCALLISTER: Right.

12                   LT. DET. MERNER: Have you noticed if he  
13 has any new shoes?

14                   MS. MCALLISTER: He does not have new  
15 shoes. I monitor all his shoes.

16                   LT. DET. MERNER: You what?

17                   MS. MCALLISTER: I pick out all his  
18 shoes.

19                   LT. DET. MERNER: You monitor them.

20                   MS. MCALLISTER: Yeah. I've seen them.  
21 I looked -- you know, like I see in the  
22 apartment. The ones that I don't like, I hide  
23 from him, so I mean, like I know where all of  
24 his shoes are, basically.

1                   LT. DET. MERNER: Okay, all right.  
2                   Sergeant Duff, do you have any further  
3                   questions at this time?

4 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

5 Q                You say that Phil is a homebody more or less?

6 A                Right. We both are. I mean, we're in the  
7                   apartment 24/7. I mean, he doesn't have a life  
8                   because he's in medical school.

9 Q                Okay. And you also said you weren't at the  
10                  apartment for more or less the past month?

11 A                Right, but I can tell you that every single  
12                  night I talk to him on the home phone.

13 Q                You call him on the home phone?

14 A                On the home phone.

15 Q                Okay. And you also said that he can take his  
16                  classes at home?

17 A                He can -- the professors will lecture online so  
18                  he can access it from his computer. So I'm  
19                  sitting right there and he's sitting right  
20                  there, just watching his lectures, so.

21 Q                Does he have to watch those lectures at a  
22                  particular time or can he pull them up?

23 A                No. He can do it whenever he wants. So he can  
24                  -- if they're in the morning, he can watch them



1 at night, which is what he does a lot.

2 Q He can access them through BU and click on a  
3 link and watch today's lecture at any time he  
4 wants?

5 A Right.

6 Q And you weren't there for the past month. Would  
7 there be anyone else that -- who's a very good  
8 friend of his who might be able to help us out?

9 A I mean, he doesn't have any great friends. He  
10 has a couple of friends at BU that I don't even  
11 know that well, but, I mean, like I said, we  
12 don't hang out with people that much. We don't  
13 have money to go out so it's like, we're at home  
14 most of the time.

15 BY LT. DET. MERNER:

16 Q And just speaking on the money issue, let me  
17 just go back a little bit. You mentioned that  
18 you go to Foxwoods a couple times a month.

19 A Mm-hmm.

20 Q And do you know approximately how much he spends  
21 gambling?

22 A A couple hundred. If he's up he'll keep  
23 playing, but if he loses money, he'll stop. So  
24 he's not going to walk out of the casino with

1 less than he came in with. So what I'm saying  
2 is, like, you know, if he's up, he'll keep  
3 betting.

4 Q If someone were to describe Phil as a moderate  
5 to heavy gambler or Phil were to describe  
6 himself as a moderate to heavy gambler, would  
7 you be surprised by that?

8 A Yes.

9 Q Okay.

10 A I don't think he's a heavy gambler at all. I  
11 think he just -- I mean, he likes to do it.  
12 That's like one of his hobbies, so, you know,  
13 he'll go and do it every once in a while, and he  
14 has fun doing it and so.

15 Q Has he ever explained to you about gambling  
16 problems and losing money and --

17 A No. I mean, I'm usually right next to him. I  
18 think he's only been to Foxwoods once when I  
19 wasn't with him and I mean, I'll be right next  
20 to him and I'll be, like, all right, let's stop,  
21 you know, if it's been, you know, an hour or  
22 two, so. It's not --

23 Q Do you know when it was that he went to Foxwoods  
24 without you?

1 A No.

2 Q I mean, was it a month ago, six months ago, a  
3 year ago, just ballpark?

4 A Maybe a couple months ago.

5 Q A couple months ago. So that would have been  
6 around February?

7 A I don't know. I'm not very good with dates.

8 Q Well, would he have spent the night down there  
9 by himself?

10 A No, definitely not. 'Cause he -- 'cause he told  
11 me that he was going to Foxwoods and then I  
12 called him, you know, and I heard all the, you  
13 know, Foxwoods around him. And then he called  
14 me from the home phone when he got home. I  
15 mean, he tells me where he's going, when he's  
16 going to be there and when he's going to be  
17 home, and then he'll call me from the home phone  
18 so I know he's there, you know.

19 Q Okay. And you mentioned that Phil has a leather  
20 jacket similar to the leather jacket you see in  
21 the photos?

22 A He has a leather jacket.

23 Q Do you know where it is?

24 A Do I know where it is?

1 Q Yeah. Is it at home now or is it in the car or  
2 --

3 A It's probably at home 'cause I don't think he  
4 wore it out when we were going today, but --

5 Q And did you bring any type of an overnight bag  
6 or any type of --

7 A Yeah. We have -- we have luggage in the trunk  
8 of our car.

9 Q Okay.

10 A Of his -- of the Toyota that we got pulled over  
11 in.

12 Q And that's just stuff for overnight?

13 A Yes.

14 Q Okay. And do you know if the leather jacket is  
15 in the car? Did he pack the leather jacket?

16 A I don't think so because --

17 Q Okay.

18 A -- it's warmer out now. I don't think he'd  
19 wear it.

20 Q How about ball caps? Have you ever seen Phil  
21 wearing a ball cap?

22 A He has them, but he never does. I -- I don't  
23 like them on him, so I tell him not to. So I  
24 haven't seen him wear, like, a baseball cap in,

1           you know, over a year.

2       Q     Any of the ball caps that he has, do any of them  
3           stand out on you as any particular team?  Is he  
4           a Red Sox fan?

5       A     He doesn't like the Red Sox.  He -- Yankees,  
6           he's -- he kind of likes the Yankees, not too  
7           much.  I think he likes the Orioles.

8       Q     Okay.

9       A     I've never seen him wear a baseball cap with a  
10          baseball team on it, though.  I've seen him wear  
11          like -- I don't -- I haven't seen him wear a cap  
12          in a year.

13      Q     Any school hats, any like SUNY or BU or any of  
14          those type of hats?

15      A     No, no.  No SUNY, no BU caps, no.

16      Q     Any insignias that you can recall?

17      A     Uh-uh.

18      Q     How about a firearm?  Have you ever seen Phil  
19          with a firearm?

20      A     No.

21      Q     Never?

22      A     Never.

23      Q     And if there was a firearm in your house, would  
24          you be aware of it?

1 A I would, I would.

2 Q And you said you monitor his shoes. Do you go  
3 through any of his other stuff to see --

4 A Yes. Well, I mean, he's very open about  
5 everything, so he doesn't care if I'm, you know,  
6 searching the apartment or stuff, so I know of  
7 everything that's going on.

8 BY SGT. DET. DUFF:

9 Q How about the car? Would you be familiar with  
10 what's in the car, in the trunk of the car?

11 A With what's in his car?

12 Q Yes.

13 A Yeah, because when he picked me up from the  
14 train station, you know, put my luggage in it  
15 and today when we were going, he put our luggage  
16 in it. I mean, I think -- I don't think there's  
17 much in there except for our luggage right now.

18 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay.

19 SGT. DET. DUFF: Okay.

20 LT. DET. MERNER: I have no further  
21 questions.

22 MS. MCALLISTER: I mean, is this -- do  
23 you think this is the guy that's been in the  
24 hotels or --

1 LT. DET. MERNER: That's why we're here.

2 MS. MCALLISTER: Is there like a million  
3 people that this could be? 'Cause this is very  
4 worrisome, you know.

5 LT. DET. MERNER: I can understand your  
6 concern. I think -- I think, you know, one of  
7 the things that's most worrisome for us is that  
8 an online e-mail was initiated from an IP  
9 address in your apartment.

10 MS. MCALLISTER: Mm-hmm.

11 LT. DET. MERNER: The individual that we  
12 believe that showed up to complete that online  
13 message or date is the individual in the  
14 picture, and the first picture you looked at,  
15 you thought he looked quite similar to Phil.

16 MS. MCALLISTER: Okay. And then --

17 LT. DET. MERNER: So for us --

18 MS. MCALLISTER: But does this have to  
19 do with the masseuse?

20 LT. DET. MERNER: Yes.

21 MS. MCALLISTER: Is that what you're  
22 saying? Oh, okay.

23 SGT. DET. DUFF: Yes. And you've been  
24 with Phil for a couple years now, and you're

1 engaged.

2 MS. MCALLISTER: Yes.

3 SGT. DET. DUFF: And you love him.

4 MS. MCALLISTER: Yes, I do.

5 SGT. DET. DUFF: Okay. Would you try to  
6 protect him if he did something wrong? Would  
7 you lie for him?

8 MS. MCALLISTER: I would not lie for him  
9 if he did something like this, no, I wouldn't.

10 SGT. DET. DUFF: Something like what?

11 MS. MCALLISTER: Like with what you're  
12 telling me, if he's out killing people.

13 SGT. DET. DUFF: I don't think we ever  
14 actually said that.

15 MS. MCALLISTER: I don't know what  
16 happened to the masseuse. Can you tell me what  
17 happened to the masseuse?

18 LT. DET. MERNER: In one of the  
19 instances they've been robbed and in another  
20 instance they've been killed.

21 MS. MCALLISTER: Okay, okay. I just, I  
22 would never, ever, ever think he would ever do  
23 something like that, ever.

24 LT. DET. MERNER: Okay.



1 MS. MCALLISTER: That's being honest.  
2 Like, I, you know, he doesn't get angry often.  
3 He's not an angry person. He's a medical  
4 student, you know.

5 LT. DET. MERNER: Right. And, you know,  
6 sometimes things happen where, you know, the  
7 intention is not to harm anybody.

8 MS. MCALLISTER: Right.

9 LT. DET. MERNER: The intention is for  
10 financial gain and sometimes --

11 MS. MCALLISTER: Right.

12 LT. DET. MERNER: -- other things happen  
13 where, you know, accidents happen.

14 MS. MCALLISTER: No. He -- he complains  
15 about money all the time, that, you know, we  
16 have no money, so he's not going to rob  
17 somebody. That's not how he's going to go  
18 about getting money. He'll go to the casino  
19 and try to win money. He's not going to rob  
20 somebody.

21 SGT. DET. DUFF: Does he win a lot?

22 MS. MCALLISTER: Sometimes.

23 SGT. DET. DUFF: Does he lose sometimes?

24 MS. MCALLISTER: He does lose sometimes.

1           If he loses, we go home.  If he keeps winning,  
2           then --

3                     SGT. DET. DUFF:  Okay.  And the way  
4           casinos usually work is the odds are in their  
5           favor.  They usually win more often than the  
6           player does, correct?

7                     MS. MCALLISTER:  Right, right, right.  
8           He doesn't -- I mean, he -- if he wins, he  
9           doesn't win that much, but --

10                    LT. DET. MERNER:  But have you ever had  
11           any -- sorry, Dan.

12                    SGT. DET. DUFF:  If you would have to  
13           characterize how he plays, does he beat the  
14           casino most of the time?  No?

15                    MS. MCALLISTER:  No.  He breaks even.  
16           He breaks even, usually.  I mean, if he --  
17           he'll win more than most people, I think,  
18           but --

19                    LT. DET. MERNER:  You mentioned his  
20           cellphone and some of the bills that you have.

21                    MS. MCALLISTER:  Mm-hmm.

22                    LT. DET. MERNER:  And do you pay your  
23           own cellphone or does he pay that as well?

24                    MS. MCALLISTER:  My parents do.

1                   LT. DET. MERNER: Your parents do. And  
2                   how about his?

3                   MS. MCALLISTER: His parents do.

4                   LT. DET. MERNER: Okay. And at any time  
5                   has any of the services, any of your services  
6                   been cut off where you had to use --

7                   MS. MCALLISTER: Yes, yeah. When I was  
8                   home last about a month ago, the Blackberry he  
9                   has, he pays for Internet service on it. He  
10                  wasn't getting Internet service on it so he  
11                  went to Verizon, and I guess they fixed it. I  
12                  don't know if they completely fixed it. I  
13                  think he still -- but for like a month or two,  
14                  he wasn't getting Internet service on the  
15                  Blackberry.

16                  LT. DET. MERNER: At any time have you  
17                  used any type of, you know, phone cards or, you  
18                  know, phones that are just five minutes for  
19                  you; what do they call them, like the minute  
20                  phones at any of these drugstores or anything  
21                  like that?

22                  MS. MCALLISTER: No.

23                  LT. DET. MERNER: Have you ever seen any  
24                  of those around the house?

1 MS. MCALLISTER: No.

2 SGT. DET. DUFF: Was there ever a time  
3 when his Blackberry was completely out of  
4 service?

5 MS. MCALLISTER: No, just -- just like I  
6 said, when I was home last month, he was having  
7 these problems where he wasn't getting the  
8 e-mails. He wasn't -- he paid for the Internet  
9 service on the Blackberry and he wasn't getting  
10 it, so he went to Verizon twice. I think  
11 Verizon fixed it. They said if it keeps doing  
12 this, you know, come back and they'll send him  
13 a new phone. So I don't know what happened  
14 because that's when I went home, so. But I  
15 know that that's what happened.

16 LT. DET. MERNER: All right. I have no  
17 further questions. Sergeant Duff?

18 SGT. DET. DUFF: No further questions,  
19 no.

20 LT. DET. MERNER: Would you be willing,  
21 if we do up some other questions, to come back  
22 in for an interview?

23 MS. MCALLISTER: Sure. I mean, is there  
24 any reason for me to be, like, scared to go

1 home with this person? Might be outside?

2 LT. DET. MERNER: At this time, we're  
3 going to make some decisions. We're going to  
4 actually -- we don't know what's going on  
5 outside this room, so we're going to --

6 MS. MCALLISTER: Like, I just --

7 LT. DET. MERNER: Do you have any reason  
8 to fear him?

9 MS. MCALLISTER: No, not at all, but I'm  
10 just --

11 LT. DET. MERNER: Are you --

12 MS. MCALLISTER: You're worrying me.

13 LT. DET. MERNER: Well, I can see. This  
14 is very serious business, and, you know, we  
15 don't mean to worry you. We don't mean to  
16 alarm you in any way. This is pretty serious  
17 and, you know, that's what we do. We  
18 investigate homicides here.

19 MS. MCALLISTER: Right. I mean, are  
20 there other people that were at this hotel that  
21 could have done this so?

22 LT. DET. MERNER: That's why we have an  
23 ongoing, active investigation.

24 MS. MCALLISTER: Okay, okay. No, I'm

just wondering if he's one of two, or one of, you know, 30.

LT. DET. MERNER: Well, all I know is, you know, just following an investigation logically the way that we do, you know, an online Internet date so-to-speak or appointment was made from a computer in your apartment at the same time that an individual that resembles your fiance shows up at the hotel where the crime occurred, okay, was at the hotel when the crime occurred, so, I think, you know --

MS. MCALLISTER: I mean, because my mom was like worried. She's like, you're going up to Boston; don't be going, you know, into hotels. So that's where I know it from, so now --

LT. DET. MERNER: So I will, you know, we will try and answer questions you have. I'll leave you my card and Sergeant Duff's card, and, you know, we'd probably like to talk to you one more time at least, and, you know, if you're willing to do that, that would be great.

SGT. DET. DUFF: I'm sure there's some

questions that we either forgot to ask you or didn't think to ask you.

MS. MCALLISTER: Okay. And who is questioning him right now? Do you know or is he --

LT. DET. MERNER: I think he's finished.

MS. MCALLISTER: He's done, okay.

LT. DET. MERNER: As far as I know, but again, we're inside this room so I'm not sure. And I'll grab you a card.

SGT. DET. DUFF: I know we introduced ourselves. I really don't expect you to remember our names. That's why I'm going to give you my card.

LT. DET. MERNER: And I'll give you one when we get out of the room.

SGT. DET. DUFF: Okay, there you go. It is 4:21 p.m. by my watch. Thanks for your time.
